- 18 BY MR. OLSKY:
- 19 Q. Good morning, Ms. Hartman.
- 20 A. Hi.
- 21 Q. We are going to have a deposition today
- 22 where I'm going to ask some questions. Have you
- ever been deposed before?
- 24 A. No.
- Q. So I'm going to ask some questions and

1	Q. Ms. Hartman, why did you leave your
2	position?
3	A. The stress, the abusive interaction of
4	the executive staff, the chaos, the unscrupulous
5	behavior towards employees. I just couldn't
6	function anymore because I didn't agree with
7	them and I felt like I was being abused.
8	Q. In what way did you feel like you were
9	being abused?
10	A. Shouting, slamming things on the desks,
11	you know, being sworn at, and also the low pay.
12	Q. In the course of your work at Folium,
13	did you come to know of a document called a
14	certificate of analysis?
15	A. Yes.
16	Q. How did you come to learn of the
17	certificate of analysis?
18	A. It was a standard operating procedure
19	that was supposed to go out with the new batches
20	of product. I also saw quite a few of them and
21	I was asked to alter them.
22	Q. Let's start with what is a certificate
23	of analysis?
24	A. An analysis of the hemp oil showing
25	components and hopefully lack of unwanted

- 1 particles such as lead, also the percentages of
- 2 CBD and THC in the product.
- MR. BAILEY: I tried not to cut off on
- 4 the answer. I wanted to object to the last
- 5 answer as unresponsive.
- 6 Q. (BY MR. OLSKY): What were you asked to
- 7 alter with respect to certificates of analysis?
- 8 MR. BAILEY: Form.
- 9 A. (BY THE WITNESS): Dates. Dates of
- 10 analysis, I guess I should say.
- 11 Q. (BY MR. OLSKY): And who asked you to
- 12 alter?
- 13 A. Jenna.
- Q. Did you discuss the matter with
- 15 Mr. Shan?
- 16 A. No.
- 17 Q. What did Jenna tell you to do?
- 18 A. Change the date from an older date to a
- 19 newer date or the current date.
- Q. And what did she say was the reason that
- 21 you were changing the date?
- MR. BAILEY: Form.
- 23 A. (BY THE WITNESS): She didn't give me a
- 24 reason.
- Q. (BY MR. OLSKY): Was it your

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1 understanding that the certificates of analysis 2 Actually, let me rephrase that. 3 What was your understanding of why 4 it was that you were changing the dates on the 5 certificates of analysis? 6 My presumed understanding was that they didn't want to pay for new tests. Previously 7 when paying accounts for the lab corporation who 8 9 was running the tests, Kashif would express his 10 displeasure at the amount of money we were spending on these tests and why did we need 11 12 these tests all the time. So it was my 13 understanding -- I mean, I presumed that we were 14 doing this so that we wouldn't have to do new 15 tests and pay for new tests. 16 So turning to the certificates of 0. 17 analysis that you were asked to alter, what do 18 you know about whether those certificates of 19 analysis had already gone out with shipments, 20 prior shipments? 2.1 MR. 6	number, so my understanding was that these were
7	older certificates that we were updating to be
8	sent out for the new product.
9	Q. (BY MR. OLSKY): So why were you taking
10	certificates of analysis for a prior shipment
11	and then putting it out with the new shipment?
12	MR. BAILEY: Form.
13	A. (BY THE WITNESS): Because we didn't
14	have anything to send out with the new
15	shipments. We didn't have any current
16	certificates or that the current certificates
17	that we did have was not appropriate to be
18	mailed out.
19	Q. (BY MR. OLSKY): What do you mean by it
20	was not appropriate to be mailed out?
21	A. It may have shown too much THC, not
22	enough CBD, contaminants.
23	Q. So to what extent did the certificates
24	of analysis that you were asked to alter to show

what was actually being shipped out?

1	MR. BAILEY: Form.
2	A. (BY THE WITNESS): It I have no idea
3	how it would match at all. I mean, to what
4	extent, there would be no relation about the
5	contents, you know, no relation to the contents
6	for the new batch. It would have no relation.
7	Q. So to summarize, you were asked to alter
8	certificate of analysis from a prior shipment
9	that did not actually match the new shipment
10	that was going out; is that correct?
11	MR. BAILEY: Form.
12	A. (BY THE WITNESS): Correct.
13	Q. (BY MR. OLSKY): And did you talk to
14	Jenna about this?
15	A. At the time it was there was a lot of
16	activity and, you know, demands on my time. So
17	basically she would show up and say, Here,
18	change this, I need it right now. And so, you
19	know, I didn't really have the opportunity to
20	examine her motives or question her; I was just
21	trying to get that off my plate so I could
22	concentrate on my other demands.
23	Q. What was your understanding sorry.
24	Let me rephrase that.
25	Did you ever respond to her when

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she m	ade that	t request?
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- 2 Basically I would respond about, you 3 know, how I was using my time and that I needed 4 to do this, that, or the other thing. She would push back; and after struggling with some of the 5 6 editing, the software, eventually I was able to push prior -- or the following requests off back 7 to her for her to do or for her to find the 8 9 graphic designer to do it. That's actually how 10 I kind of solved that request. I actually did alter at least two of the certificates; but 11
- after, you know, having the opportunity to think
  about what I was doing, I pushed off the request
- and redirected it to the graphic designer.
- 15 Q. (BY MR. OLSKY): Who was the graphic designer?
- 17 MR. BAILEY: Nonresponsive.
- 18 A. (BY THE WITNESS): Isaac Rush.
- 19 Q. (BY MR. OLSKY): And are you aware of 20 Isaac Rush continuing to change -- let me
- 21 rephrase it. Sorry.
- Do you know whether Isaac Rush
- 23 continued to change certificates of analysis in
- 24 a similar manner?
- MR. BATLEY: Form.

1	A. (BY THE WITNESS): I know at least two
2	times the request was routed his way because
3	Jenna claims that her Chromebook didn't enable
4	her to work on this. I know at least two other
5	times Isaac would have helped her up on that.
6	Any further request would have been directly to
7	him.
8	Q. (BY MR. OLSKY): Do you know whether
9	anyone else at Folium in addition to Mr. Rush
10	changed certificates of analysis in the way that
11	you were describing?
12	A. I am not sure about the certificates of
13	analysis; however, I do know that Quan Nguyen
14	would edit documents, edit PDFs. For instance,
15	to get a signature from Kash when he wasn't
16	available, he would copy a signature from a wire
17	transfer form to do a new wire transfer form,
18	something like that.
