



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Our Perspective – February Update



Nucleus One's Perspective

- Our last report showed a decline in sales in November 2020 but this was a short-lived headwind: since then, the Massachusetts adult-use has broken new sales records in both December and January with 98 retailers now active across the Commonwealth.
- January sales jumped to \$87.1M up 68% from last year. Based on these new highs, annualized sales now top \$1 billion and counting. The retail economics also show strong resilience with daily sales per store stabilizing around \$30k, while the share of flower has hit an all-time low in December (45.1% vs. 54) confirming the growth of other product categories.
- The value potential of the Massachusetts medical and adult-use markets has been confirmed again on Feb. 22 with the announcement that NETA, the largest Massachusetts operator measured by active agents (1,575), and its parent company, Parallel, would go public following a SPAC agreement with Ceres Acquisition Corp., valuing the company at \$1.9B.
- Meanwhile, the Cannabis Control Comission has had an active start to 2021, publishing new Medical and Adult Use Regulations on January 8th and welcoming three new commissioners, Nurys Z. Camargo, Bruce Stebbins and Ava Callender Concepcion. Challenges to the new delivery rules were also dropped, clearing the way for an exciting delivery market that has only become more relevant as the new consumption habits of the "New Normal" seem to stick.

As stores continue to open at a fast pace, the Massachusetts adult-use retail sales reached anew heights in early 2021

What's New

- Parallel, parent company of NETA, has entered into an agreement with Ceres, a SPAC that would allow the company to go public at a valuation of \$1.9B.
- The Cannabis Control Commission published New Medical and Adult Use Regulations on January 8th and also welcomed three new commissioners this year: Nurys Z. Camargo, Bruce Stebbins and Ava Callender Concepcion.
- Northampton waived the community impact fee of 3% on gross sales for cannabis businesses, amending the 23 HCA agreements with 17 companies.
- The Commonwealth Dispensary Association and Foley Hoag dropped legal challenges against the new delivery rules after several members left the organization over fears about equity on Jan 22-23.
- The medical marijuana program has recorded a significant uptick since the beginning of the pandemic: the milestone of 100,000 patients has just been reached, up from 67,742 in March 2020.
- Good Feels Inc. in Medway received its provisional license, paving the way to the second THC-infused beverage manufacturer after Cultivauna, LLC (LEVIA brand) which just launched a seltzer across 45+ retail stores.
- Discussions about eliminating the vertical integration requirement for medical operators is likely to start in the next few months according to Steven Hoffman.




Cannabis Consumption Trends




Massachusetts cannabis consumption increased dramatically over the last 10 years and is bound to grow further

Past month vs. Past year Consumption in Mass.




- With a past year use rate of 20.9%, Massachusetts is only #11-#12 among all U.S. states
- There is still substantial room for growth when compared to #1 Oregon (28.6%) and #2 Colorado (27.8%)

Comments

- As more stores open across the Commonwealth, the number of employees in the Massachusetts industry continue to grow steadily.
- The number of employees has jumped by 72% year-on-year, approaching 7,000 as of December.
- Monthly harvests hit a new all-time high in December 2020 with 49.3k plants, beating July 2020 record.
- In January 2021, operators harvested 42k plants, a 48% increase from a year earlier
- We expect the 50k-plant threshold to broken within the next 3 months as new cultivation capacity comes live





Number of Applications by Category and Status








The number of final licenses has more than doubled over the past year to 246 and a record 25 final licenses were granted in January

Additional Cumulated Final Licenses by Month and License Type






Overview of Applications - Municipal Status



As of December 8, 190 municipalities are already or are in the process of being zoned for adult use marijuana retail




- The CCC has recently published and updated a municipal zoning tracker providing more clarity into the status of adult use marijuana by town/city.
- Nucleus One has summarized the data to provide a simple view at the municipal level.
- Note: this classification does not capture the full complexity and specificity of local regulations and ordinances.
- Adult-use marijuana is still banned or partially banned in 120+ communities.

724 licenses have been approved across the Commonwealth






Retail Licenses - Pending

- Brockton: 5






Retail Licenses – Provisionally Approved

 The provided establishment size includes cultivation and manufacturing square footage in some cases






Retail Licenses - Active



98 adult use retail stores operate as of February 23, 2021






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Licensed Businesses – Top 15 by License Type

Total = 12,398 vs.11,827 (+571) (inc. other license types)






Licensed Businesses – Top 25 Businesses

Top 25 Largest Licensed Businesses by License Type and # Active Agent Registrations






Retail Sales Growth – Monthly Sales


- Retail sales reached an all-time high in January with \$87.1 million beating the previous record of December 2020, and up 68% vs. January 2020
- After a dip in sales in November, sales have been growing fast with the holiday season
- However, the growth seems to be sustained and is expected to continue as demand and supply grow

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Retail Sales Growth - Daily Sales

Daily sales averaged \$2.8 million in January 2021: at this pace, the Massachusetts adult-use market is now \$1 billion on an annual basis

Comments

- Daily sales averaged \$2.8 million in January 2021, up 4% over December.
- In December, sales had already an all-time high of \$2.7 million, up 63% compared to year earlier
- This is hardly surprising when the number of stores jumped from 33 as of December 2019 to 94 a year later
- Based on January sales, the Massachusetts adult-use market is now \$1 billion on an annual basis



Retail Trends – Store Openings



33 new adult use stores have opened since Sept. 1, 2020, fast approaching the 100-store milestone.

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


Retail Trends – Store Economics (1/2)

Daily Sales per Store & Open Store Count






Retail Trends – Store Economics (2/2)

Average Store Sales per Weekday




Comments

- Average daily sales decreases by 27%, from an average \$44k over 1/1/20-8/31/20 to \$32k since September
- Saturday took over as the best-selling day of the week: Friday sales declined faster than Saturday sales as commuting behaviors were disrupted.




Retail Trends – Product Mix (2/2)

Comments

- In December 2020, the share of flower sales fell to an alltime low of 45.1% confirming the growth of other product categories as the market matures,
- Holiday purchases focused much more on non-flower products this year: 53.7% vs. 44.6% in 2019
- Specifically, pre-rolls hit an alltime high of 12.3% of retail sales in December 2020
- Vape products and concentrates have remained remarkably stable over the last nine months
